
(Here is your model for Lord Brahma. Hiranyakasipu is offering respect to Lord Brahma. Brahma is offering blessings.)








Years later, Hiranyakasipu gets a devoted son named Prahlad. Prahlad loves God, Krishna. He chants Krishna's names and cries out of ecstatic love for him. He is always happy and smiling. He loves to serve Krishna all the time.



Prahlad always thinks of Krishna. Separated from his Lord, he feels helpless. He did not know how his bodily necessities such as sitting, walking, eating, lying down, drinking and talking, were being automatically performed. Sometimes feeling the touch of the Lord's lotus hands, he becomes joyful and remains silent, his hairs standing on end and tears glide down from his half-closed eyes because of his love for the Lord. He loses his shyness and begins to dance in ecstasy. He imitates the pastimes of the Lord. Krishna soothes him. There is great love between Krishna and His devotee.



One day, Hiranyakasipu takes his son, Prahlad on his lap. With affection he asks, "My dear son, what is the best subject you've learnt in school?" Prahlad replies, "We are not the body. We should all serve Krishna." Hiranyakasipu scoffs, "The words of the enemy has spoiled this child."



Prahlad's teachers, Sanda and Amarka, ask gently, "Did an enemy come to the school and teach you all about Krishna?" Prahlad preaches, "Everyone of us is an eternal servant of God and therefore we are not different from one another. A learned person does not see one person as a friend and another as an enemy". 
Hiranyakasipu tries in so many ways to kill his young son. He throws Prahlad into a pit of huge, fearful snakes. The snakes don't bite him but lie peacefully around him. Prahlad stays calm, and he silently meditates on the Supreme Lord.




The demons put Prahlad into a great pot of boiling oil. Nothing happens. Prahlad is not harmed. They throw him beneath a huge elephant's feet. They give Prahlad poison. They starve him. He is exposed to severe cold, wind, fire and water.




Hiranyakasipu is miserable because he can't kill Prahlad. He loses his bodily luster. Sanda and Amarka speak to Hiranyakasipu in secret. They promise to instruct Prahlad about the duties of a materialistic king. They will teach him mundane religion, economic development, and sense gratification.




During recess, when his teachers leave the room, Prahlad teaches his classmates about Krishna. His friends admire Prahlad and listen to his instructions. They chant Krishna's names and dance in ecstasy. They can see that doing devotional service is great fun.




"Although king Indra and the other demigods are exalted personalities, they are obedient to the great sage, Narada. They understand that Narada's instructions should be followed because he is a bonafide





Prahlad tells his friends, "Krishna is in everyone's heart. He'll make us satisfied forever if we can just chant His holy name: Hare Krishna. We will be linked with Him forever and understand how to come to Him." So everyone chants and dance in ecstatic kirtan.






A fearful roar comes from the pillar. a most wonderful being, Nrsimhadeva appears. He is half-man and half-lion incarnation of Krishna. His angry eyes, and razor-sharp tongue dart about like a dueling sword. His body touches the sky. He opens His deadly jaws. Lord Nrsimhadeva catches Hiranyakasipu.




Playfully, Lord Nrsimhadeva allows Hiranyakasipu to attack with his sword. Lord Nrsimhadeva's shrill laughter frightens Hiranyakasipu. With the speed of a hawk Hiranyakasipu moves into the sky. Nrsimhadeva captures him.




As Hiranyakasipu moves his limbs hither and thither, Lord Nrsimhadeva places the demon across His lap. It is neither day nor night. In the doorway of the assembly hall the Lord very easily tears the demon to pieces with the nails of His hand. Lord Nrsimhadeva mouth and mane are sprinkled with drops of blood and His fierce eyes are full of anger. A garland of Hiranyakasipu's intestines decorates Lord Nrsimhadeva's neck.



Even after Hiranyakasipu is killed, the Lord continues to be very angry. The demigods cannot pacify Him. Laksmi, the goddess of fortune does not dare come before Lord Nrsimhadeva. Then Lord Brahma asks Prahlad to go forward and pacify His anger. Prahlad is not afraid at all. He is confident in the affection of his master. Lord Nrsimhadeva sits down on the throne of the King. No enemy comes forward to fight with the Lord. Instead, the demigods approach the Lord who glows with intense light. With their hands folded, the demigods offer their respects and prayers.





begin beating drums. Upon hearing the music, the angelic women begin to dance while the chief of the heavenly singers sweetly sings.



Prahlad Maharaja performs the ritualistic ceremonies for his father. With great pomp and ceremony, he is then enthroned in the kingdom of Hiranyakasipu as directed by the brahmanas.
