- 3. Krishna has a beautiful threefold-bending form and a charming bluish-black complexion. He wears a peacock feather on His head. His eyes are like blooming lotus petals. His nose is like a sesame flower. His lips are like a bimba fruit. There is always a captivating smile on His moonlike face. He holds an enchanting flute in His hands and attracts all His devotees with its sweet sound. He wears a beautiful Vaijayanti garland and a moon locket around His neck. He is dressed in beautiful yellow dhoti. His unique loveliness attracts everyone in the universe. Thus His beauty surpasses all concepts of beauty in the material world.

TRANSLATION

- "Know that all opulent, beautiful and glorious creations spring from but a spark of My splendor".
- 5. Hence, the beauty of everything in this world is actually due to the beauty of Krishna manifesting through these things. Therefore we should be attracted not to the beauty of this world but to the eternal beauty of Krishna.

6. ALL Attractive Krishna

- a. When He plays His flute in Vrindavan, all living beings are spontaneously attracted towards Him.
- b. The flowing river Yamuna becomes stunned in ecstasy and stops flowing.
- c. The hearts of the cows and the deer are charmed as soon as they hear the sweet sound; they spread their long ears and listen intently with tears of joy gliding down their eyes.
- d. When the calves, who are drinking milk, hear His flute, their mouths stop moving and they just drink the nectar of the sweet sound of His flute.
- e. The birds stop flying and sit frozen on the branches and twigs of the nearby trees;

f. Non-moving beings like the stones melt in ecstasy.



- g. The clouds stop moving and serve as a soothing umbrella for Krishna.
- h. In Vrindavan, the gopis are engaged in various activities. But as soon as they hear Krishna playing on His flute, some gopis, who are drawing water from the well, let go of the rope;
- i. Some gopis, who are churning the butter, just stop churning;
- j. Those who are engaged in house-hold duties, leave everything and rush to meet Krishna with great haste.
- k. Whatever they are doing, they just drop it and run swiftly to the forest to meet Krishna. Such is the all-attractiveness of Krishna.

Stories of Krishna's beauty:

- 1. Krishna was once walking through the beautiful garden of Goloka Vrndavan.
- 2. A beautiful rose saw Krishna approaching. In order to give pleasure to Krishna, the rose spread out its petals wider and became more beautiful and fragrant.
- 3. When Krishna saw the rose, He wanted to reciprocate with the rose. So He became more beautiful in return.
- 4. The rose in turn tried to become more beautiful. When Krishna saw this, He was very pleased and increased His beauty further. This reciprocation between Krishna and the rose continued.
- 5. Thus we see that there is no limitation to Krishna's beauty as compared to the beauty of material objects. In the spiritual world, even the inanimate objects have feelings and express their love for Krishna, as the ultimate goal of everyone's life is to please Krishna, The Supreme Personality of Godhead.






Krishna All famous

4th Opulence of the Supreme Lord Sri Krsna - All Knowledgeable

- 1. According to the dictionary, Knowledge means all that have been perceived or grasped by the mind.
- 2. There are many knowledgeable people like the scientist, engineers, doctors, charted accountants etc. but their knowledge is only related to their field and they do not have complete knowledge of other subjects. Therefore their knowledge is limited and incomplete.
- 3. We generally have knowledge of things because of our senses. We only realize what we can see, hear, smell, touch and taste. In today's world, technology and communications gives us knowledge of much beyond that. We know what goes on around the world and we are exploring what goes on in other planets.
- 4. But still our knowledge is limited. Our brains can only hold so much. Does anyone think they could memorize all the phone numbers for people in the city where they live? No, there is a limit to what we can remember.
- 5. Even the most advanced space ship cannot give us any information about the nearest star or galaxy, but Krishna in Bhagavad-Gita gives us information about the knowledge of the material world and the spiritual world and the spirit behind it and their source.
- 6. Krishna is the Supreme Personality of Godhead. Krishna knows everything. All knowledge comes from Krishna. He knows the past, the present and the future. He is the source of all the Vedas and the ultimate goal of studying all the Vedas is to Know Krishna.
- 7. Krishna is present as Paramatama in the hearts of all living beings- humans, animals and even plant. Thus Krishna witnesses our every thought, word and deed.
- 8. While speaking Bhagavad-Gita, Krishna told Arjuna that He instructed the same knowledge to the Sun-god, Vivasvan, millions of years ago.
- Arjuna asked Krishna, "Vivasvan is senior by birth to You. How can I understand that You instructed this science to him?" Krishna replied, "Many many births both you and I have passed. I can remember all of them, but you cannot."
- 10. Thus Krishna and Arjuna both have come to this world many times. Krishna can remember all those births and Arjuna cannot because Krishna is the Supreme




Personality of Godhead who is all knowing and Arjuna is a living entity.

- 11. There are millions of universes. And there are immeasurable atoms in each universe. Krishna is present in every atom of each universe and so He knows everything that is happening in every part of every universe.
- 12. Even when Krishna and Balarama came to the earth, They were still all knowing. They did not need to go to any school to get knowledge.
- 13. They accepted Sandipani Muni as their guru only to teach us by Their own example, how important it is for us to accept a spiritual master. And even while studying, They displayed Their extraordinary intelligence by mastering all sixty-four subjects in just sixty-four days.
- 14. Krishna never had to prepare any thing in advance when He had to speak Bhagavad-Gita to Arjun. He directly spoke 700 verses on the spot. Where as we have to learn or prepare ourselves much in advance even for one verse.
- 15. Krishna's knowledge is unlimited because He is the source of all Knowledge as He says in Bhagavad-Gita 15.15

2nd Opulence of the Supreme Lord Sri Krsna - All Strong

1. Strength is one of the opulence which many people possess. The dictionary definition of strength means -

- Force, power, toughness, durability
- The power to resist stress, strain
- The power to resist attacks.
- 2. Every body possesses some strength, but our strength is limited. We may be really strong when we are young, but we don't have the same strength when we grow old.
- 3. We have many examples in history about people who possessed great strength but with the passing of time we have seen that their strength has been slacken and even lost in many cases. For e.g. Alexander the great, Napolean Bornaparte, Hitler etc.
- 4. But in case of Krishna The Supreme Personality of Godhead is always all strong in all time, place and circumstances.
- 5. Krishna may look like a simple cowherd boy, yet He performs many wonderful pastimes, which shows how strong He is. Sometimes He comes to earth to protect His devotees and kill demons.
- 6. In the Bhagavad Gita, 10.36 He says:

'smi sattvaa sattvavatam aham

asmi—I am; sattvam—the strength; sattva-vatam—of the strong; aham—I am.

Translation: I am the strength of the strong.

KRISHNA --- ALL STRONG

- 1. When Krishna was one week old, He killed a witch called Putana.
- 2. On His first birthday, He killed a cart-demon, Shakatasura.
- 3. He killed many demons like the wind demon, Trinavarta and a huge bird demon named Bakasura. There was a fat serpent demon called Aghasura who tried to swallow the cowherd boys, of course Krishna killed him, too.
- 4. Pastime of lifting of Govardhan Hill.



Once there was a terrible storm in Vrindavan. It became very dark. Heavy rain was pouring from the sky.



It seemed as if the whole of Vrindavan was being drowned. The cowherd men and women all called out to Krishna for protection.



Although He was only seven years old, Krishna performed an amazing pastime by lifting huge Govardhan Hill on the little finger of His left hand as easily as a child lifts a mushroom.



Krishna said, "My dear devotees, I lifted this hill which will protect you exactly like a huge umbrella. Be happy here along with your animals."




Krishna stood in this way for seven days and seven nights."

- 5. Once Krishna's wicked uncle, Kamsa, had arranged a sacrifice called Dhanur Yagna.
- 6. He had placed a huge bow near the sacrificial arena. Krishna lifted the bow and very easily broke it into two pieces.
- 7. Later He killed the powerful elephant named Kuvalayapida.
- 8. Kamsa had two powerful wrestlers, Chanura and Mustika. Krishna defeated them too.
- 9. In the end Krishna dragged Kamsa from His seat and threw him in the wrestling arena.
- 10. Then Krishna beat Kamsa, repeatedly, on his chest, until he died.
- 11. In this way Krishna showed His supreme strength even as a small child.
- 12. Besides this, Krishna is holding the Sun, Moon, stars and all the planets of the Universe. Indeed we cannot understand how strong Krishna is!

Therefore, Krishna is the source of all strength. He has the most superior physical strength of any being and it is eternal with no barriers in regard to age, time, place and circumstances.

We should always remember that the strength we possess is a gift from Krishna to us hence we should not be proud or misuse this gift.



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

(TEACHER'S COPY)

- 1. Ask the students what do they understand by the word strength or the meaning?
- 2. Can they give some examples or name anyone who has shown the greatest strength/
- 3. Can have a short **activity** by having a small competition to find a strongest person in your room. For e.g. arm wrestling, sit- up or push-up or skipping or some other activity in which no one will get hurt. Keep a record and select the winner.
- 4. Ask the students whether the strength that they have right now, will they have the same strength when they were toddler, sick and old (explain that our strength is limited, temporary and keeps changing as per the physical condition. Point out that strength can mean more than physical strength, but mental strength is also very important.)
- 5. Similarly, Krishna's strength is much more than we could imagine. He has the most superior physical strength of any being and is eternal with no barriers in regard to time, place and circumstances.
- 6. You can point out that in the records of the Olympics every time a new person breaks the record of the previous one.
- 7. Remind children that Krishna possesses all the strength. We should always remember that the strength which we possess is given to us by Krishna. Hence we should not be proud, or misuse this gift from Krishna.
- 8. Ask the student if they remember how Krishna shows His strength.
 - Lifting Govardhan Hill on a little finger (in detail)
 - Krishna killing many demons in Vrindavan
- 9. Then start with the resource sheets
- 10. Finally, encourage the student to write a poem on Krishna's strength.

- 1. One of the opulence's which attracts people the most is Wealth. The dictionary definition of wealth means -
 - > Much money or property; great amount of worldly possessions
 - > Large amount or abundance
 - > Valuable products
- 2. We tend to think of wealth as money but this is not always the case. In some cultures wealth is measured in land. In others, wealth may reflect how many cows or other livestock is owned. Some cultures determine wealth by the number of sons a man has.
- 3. Real wealth means good loving relationships and natural products
- 4. There are a number of wealthy people in the world who own many houses factories and cars. People who are very rich are called multi-millionaires. They have beautiful palaces and sometimes own a private island or a beach.
- 5. But even the richest person in the world is not the owner of everything. The wealth of all these multi-millionaires is nothing as compared to the wealth of Krishna.
- 6. In the Bhagavad-Gita, 10.8 Krishna says aham sarvasya prabhavo mattah sarvam pravartate iti matva bhajante mam budha bhava-samanyitah

I am the source of all spiritual and material worlds. Everything emanates from Me. The wise who perfectly know this engage in My devotional service and worship Me with all their hearts.


KRISHNA --- ALL WEALTHY

- 1. Now let us here about the Lord's opulence in the spiritual world, which is far far greater. There are many beautiful prayers, which describe Krishna's abode, Goloka Vrindavan.
- 2. It is said that He sits on a bejeweled throne.
- 3. His palace is built with spiritual gems.
- 4. He is surrounded by millions of desire fulfilling trees.
- 5. There are thousands of Goddesses of fortune (Laxmi devi) who are constantly serving the Lord.



- 6. He is the owner of millions of universes.
- 7. The sun, moon, stars and planets are all moving under His direction. Everything belongs to Him.

Krishna displays His wealth in Dwaraka



- 1. When He came to the earth He displayed His unmatched opulence and wealth.
- 2. As the king of Dwaraka, He had 16,108 beautiful queens. He provided each one of them with a magnificent palace. Not only that, every palace was filled with invaluable jewels, diamonds, gold etc.
- 3. He also had thousands of servants and soldiers. Thus the wealth of Krishna is like the dazzling brightness of the sun, whereas the wealth of even the multi-millionaires is like the brightness of an insignificant firefly.
 - 4. Once sage Narada wanted to observe the Lord's diverse activities in this unique family situation.
 - 5. Thus he went to Dvaraka. Narada entered one of the sixteen thousand palaces and saw Goddess Rukmini personally rendering menial service to Sri Krishna, despite Her being in the company of thousands of maidservants.
 - As soon as Lord Krishna noticed Narada, He got up from His bed; offered obeisances to the sage and seated him on His own seat. Then the Lord bathed Närada's feet and sprinkled

the water on His own head. Such was the exemplary behavior of the Lord.

- 7. After conversing with the Lord for a short while, Narada went to another of His palaces, where the sage saw Sri Krishna playing dice with His queen and Uddhava.
- 8. Going from there to another palace, he found Lord Krishna cuddling His infant children.
- 9. In another palace he saw Him preparing to take a bath; In another, performing fire sacrifices, In another, feeding brahmanas. In another, eating the remnants left by brahmanas.
- 10. In one palace the Lord was performing noontime rituals. In another, quietly chanting the Gayatri mantra; In another, sleeping on His bed;
- 11. In another, consulting with His ministers;
- 12. And in yet another, He was joking and laughing with His consort
- 13. In yet another place He was meditating on the Supersoul. Somewhere He was serving His spiritual masters. Somewhere the Lord was giving charity to brahmanas
- 14. In another place He was arranging for the marriages of His sons and daughter.
- 15. Somewhere else He was going out to hunt animal. And elsewhere He was moving about in disguise to find out what the citizens were thinking.

- 16. Having seen all this, Narada addressed Lord Krishna: "Only because I have served Your lotus feet can I understand these varieties of Your Yogamaya potency, which ordinary living beings bewildered by illusion cannot begin to perceive. Thus I am most fortunate, and I simply desire to travel all over the three worlds chanting the glories of Your pastimes, which purify all the worlds."
- 17. Sri Krishna asked Narada not to be confused by his vision of the Lord's transcendental opulences and He described to him the purposes of His appearances in this world.
- 18. He then honored the sage properly, according to religious principles, and Narada departed, continuously meditating on the Supreme Personality of Godhead.

Thus, we should know that there is no end to Krishna's wealth. Whatever we have is given to us by Krishna's mercy. We can show our gratefulness to Him by learning how to use everything we have in His service.




