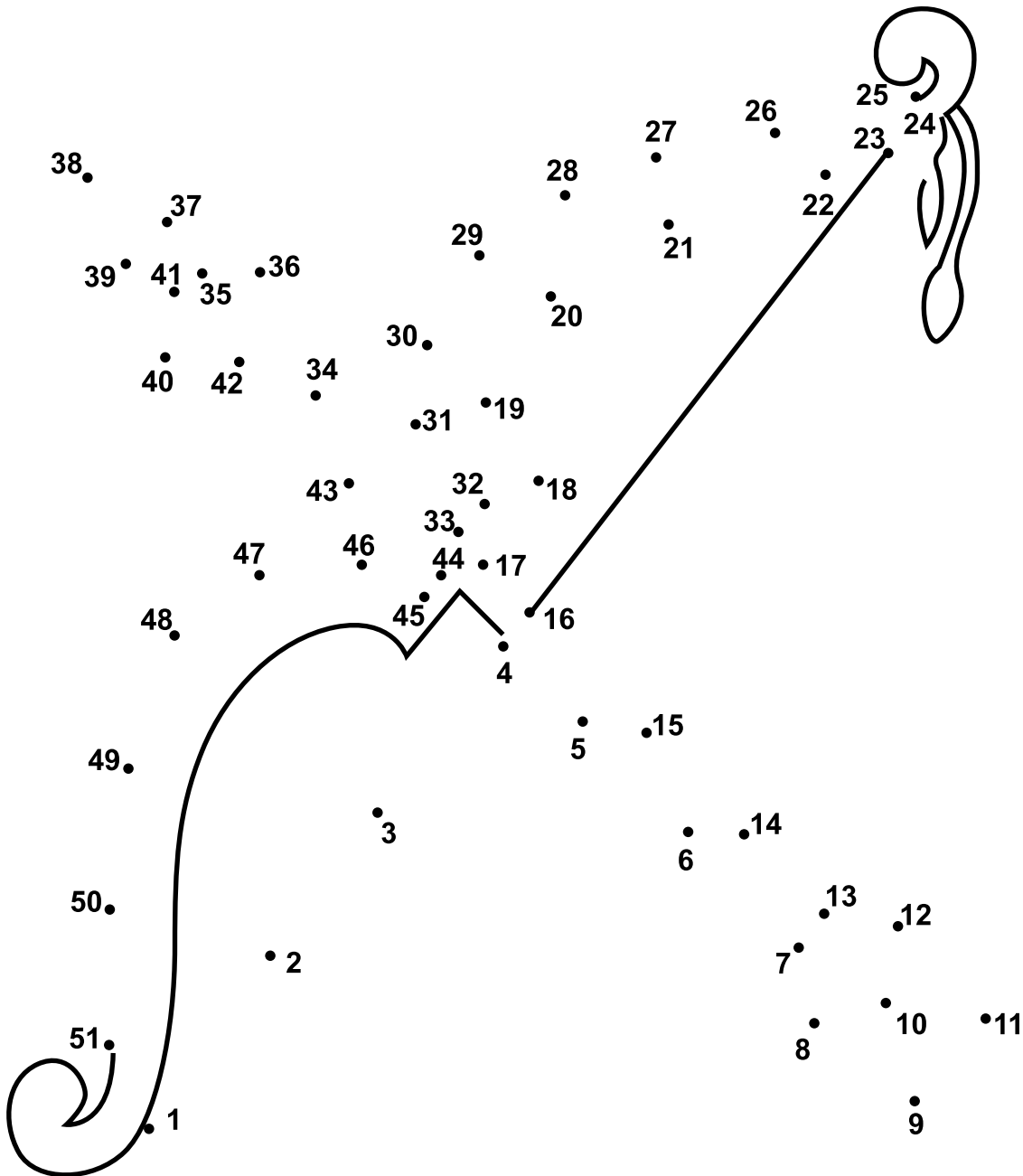

The arrow that was shot at Lord Krishna by Bhishma at the battle of Kurukshetra, was like a kiss of a flower from his devotee-warrior.

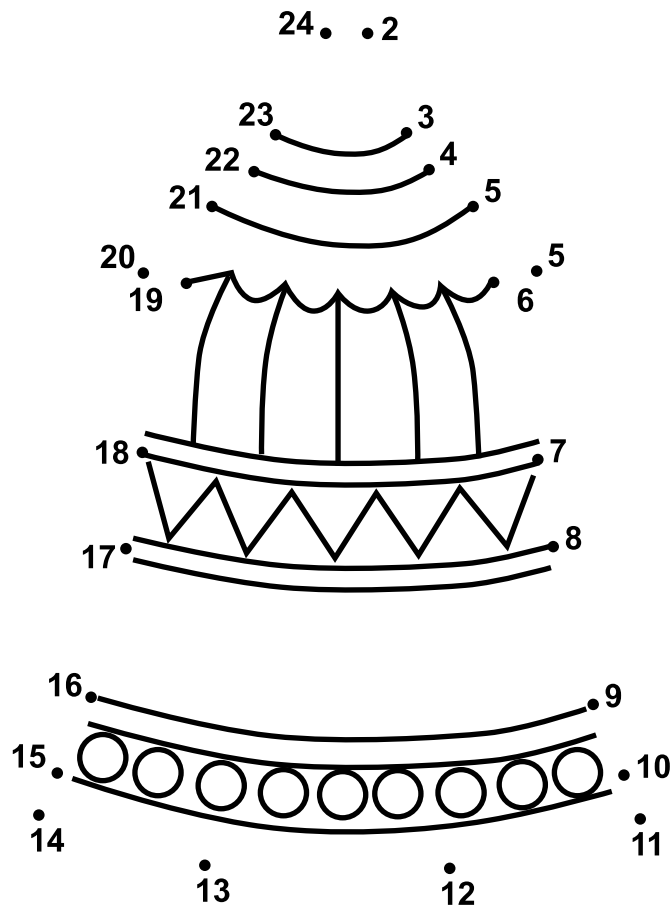
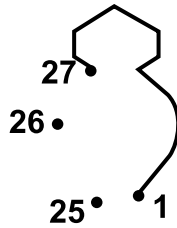

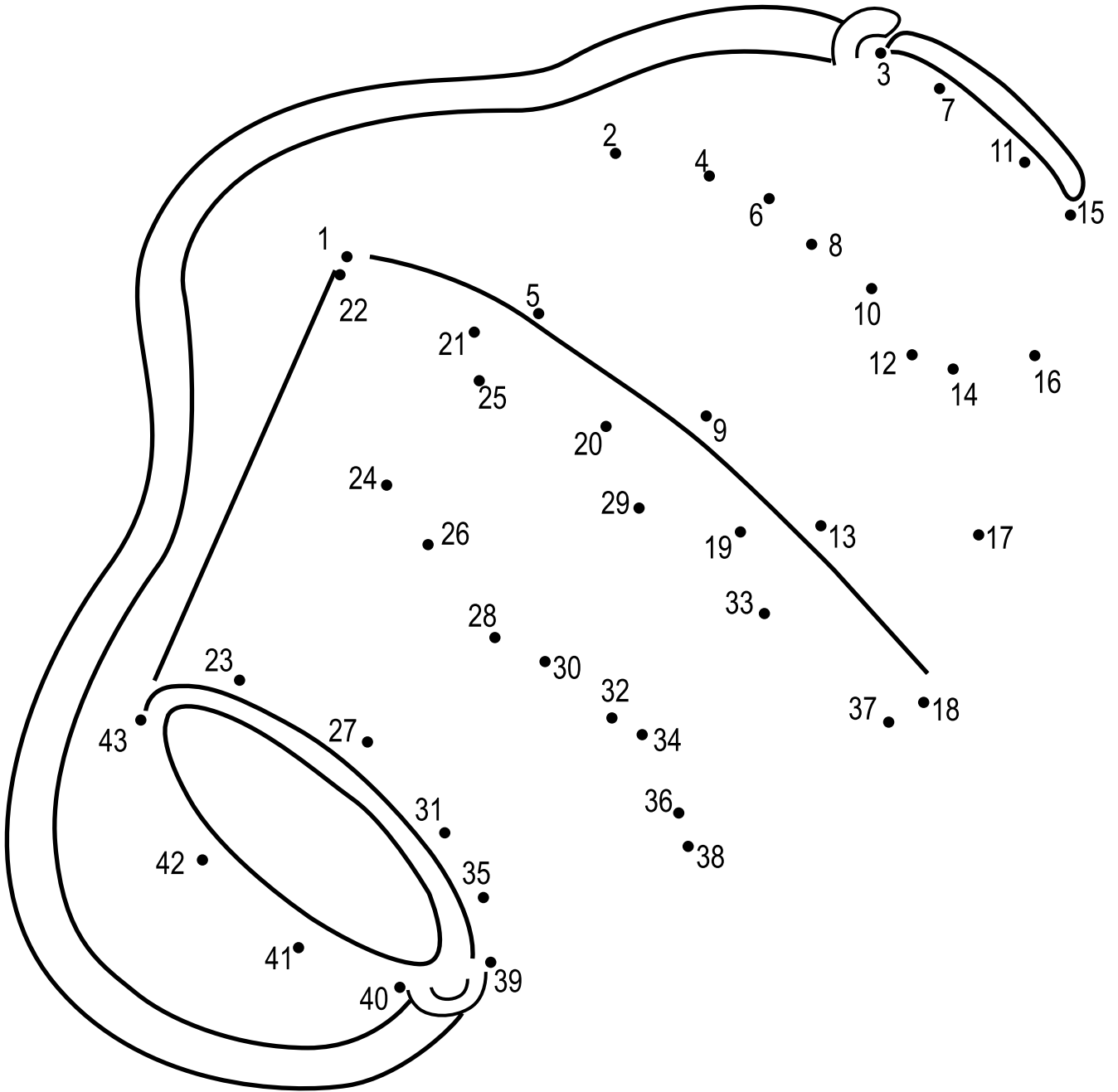

Abstinence from grains and beans is prescribed. We should chant & hear the glories of the Lord throughout the day.

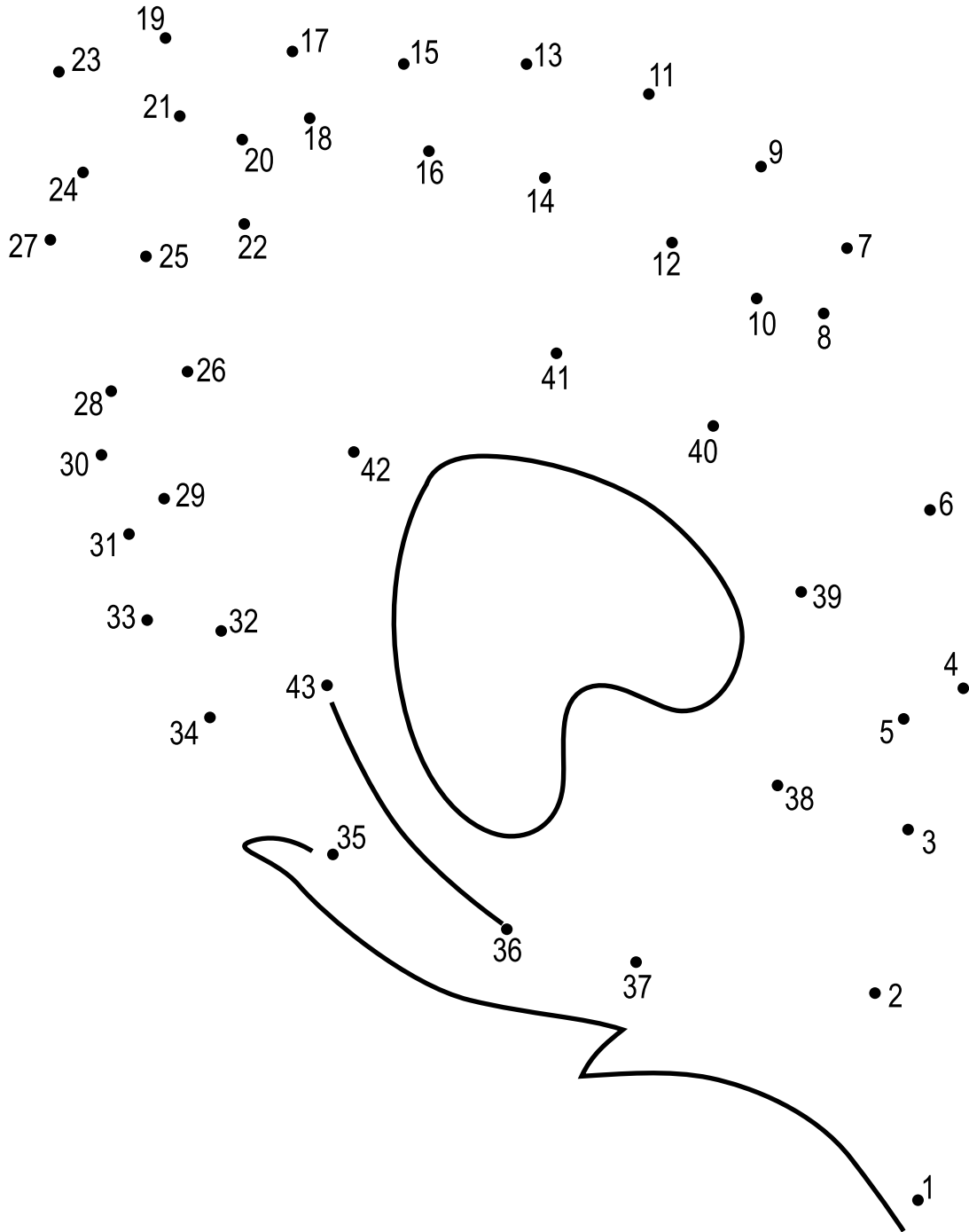

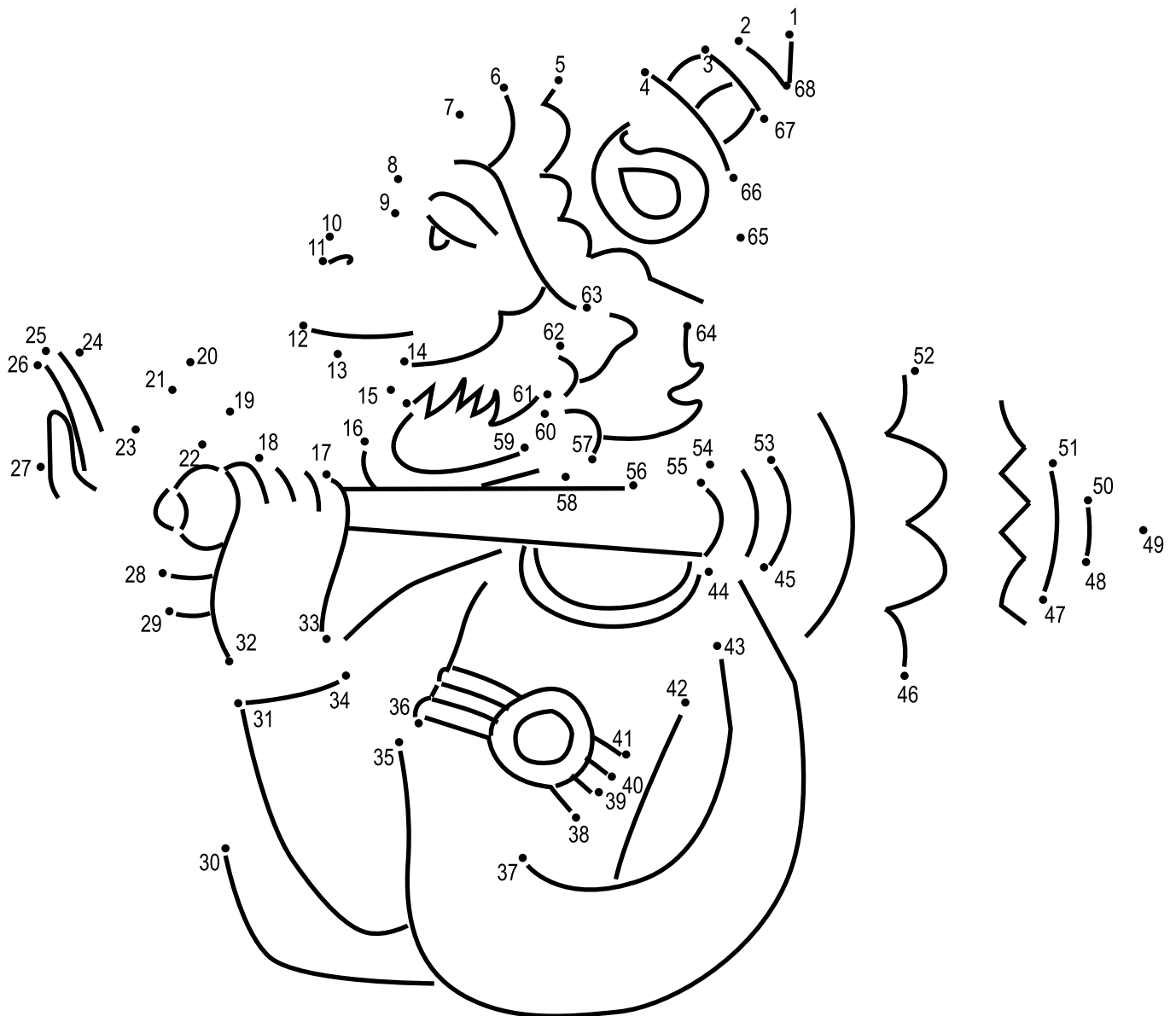

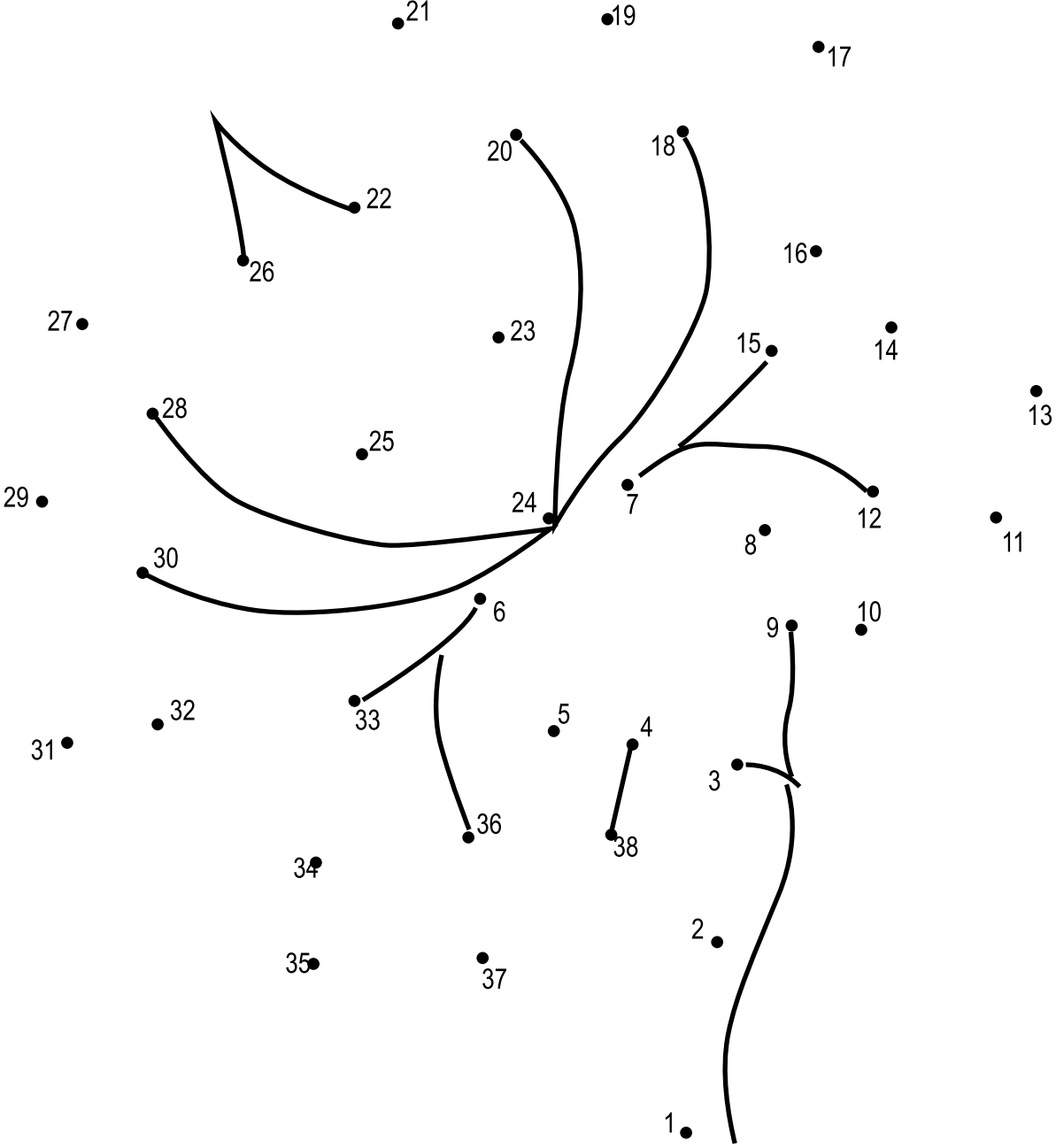

O Lord, you are always decorated with garlands of lotus flowers, whose glance is as cool as the lotus and whose feet are engraved with lotuses.

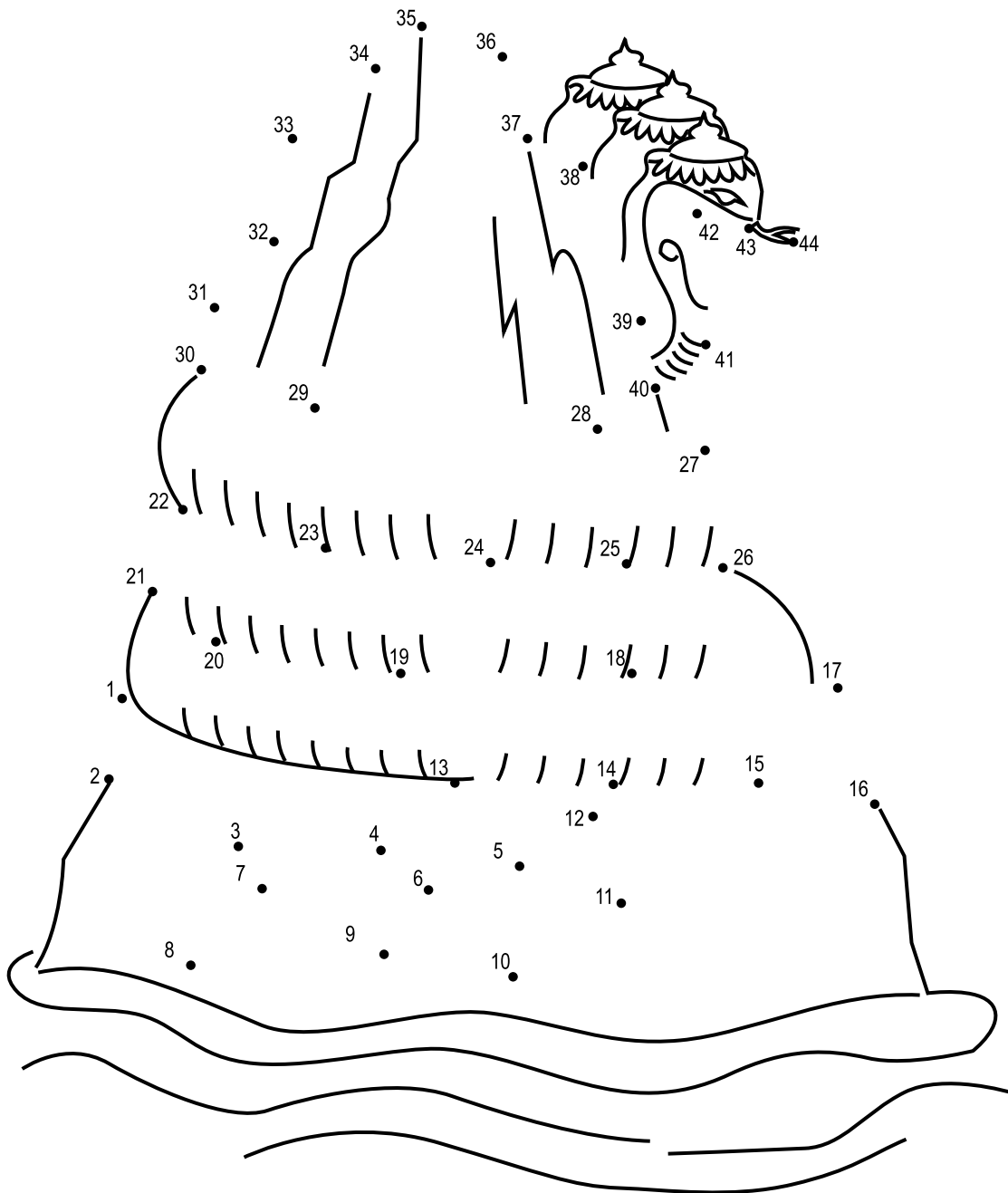

The incarnation of the Lord as a half man, half lion. He killed the demon Hiranyakasipu to save his devotee Prahlada.

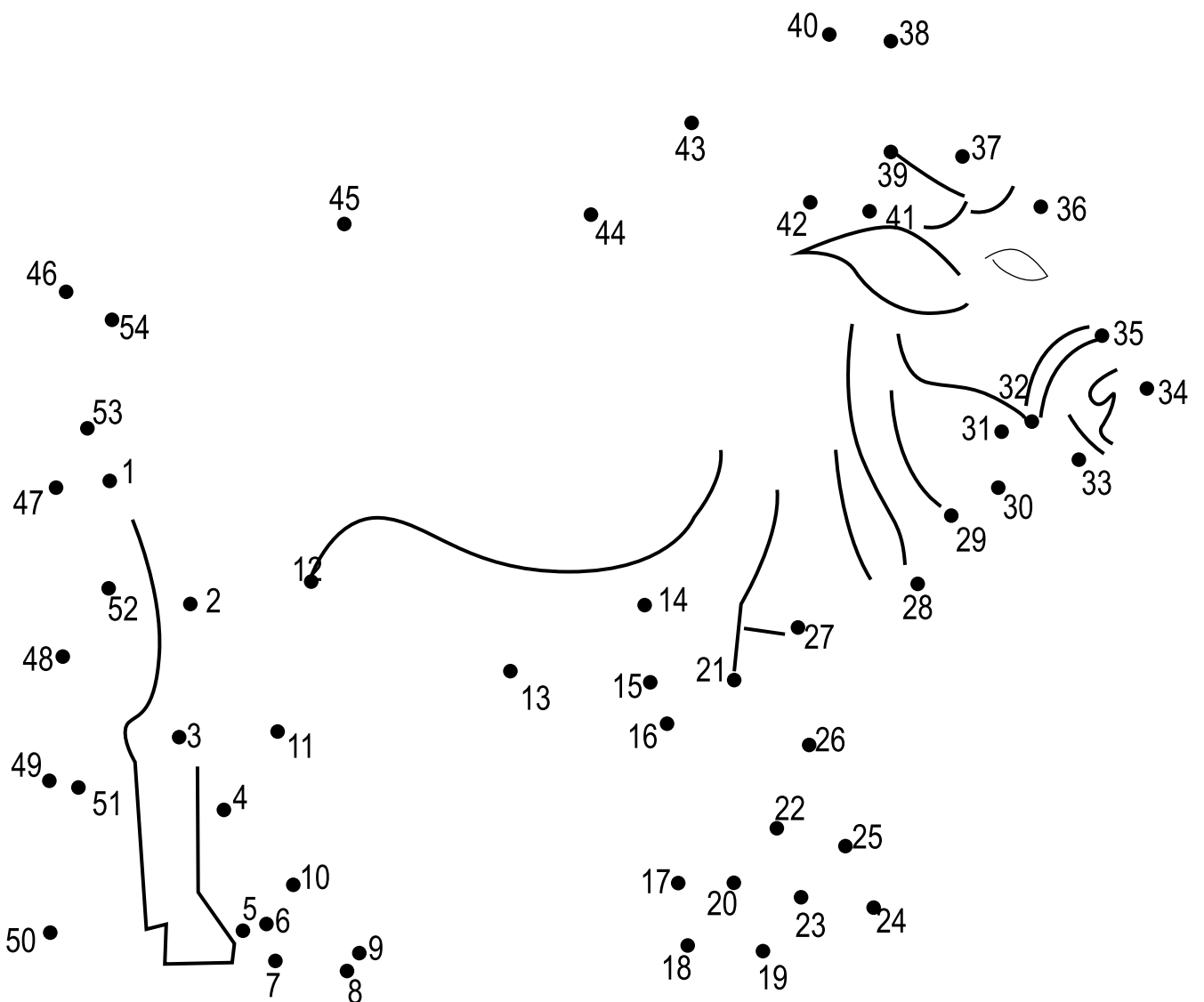

Ox is regarded as our father because it tills the lands from which the farmer produces our food grains on which our lives subsist.

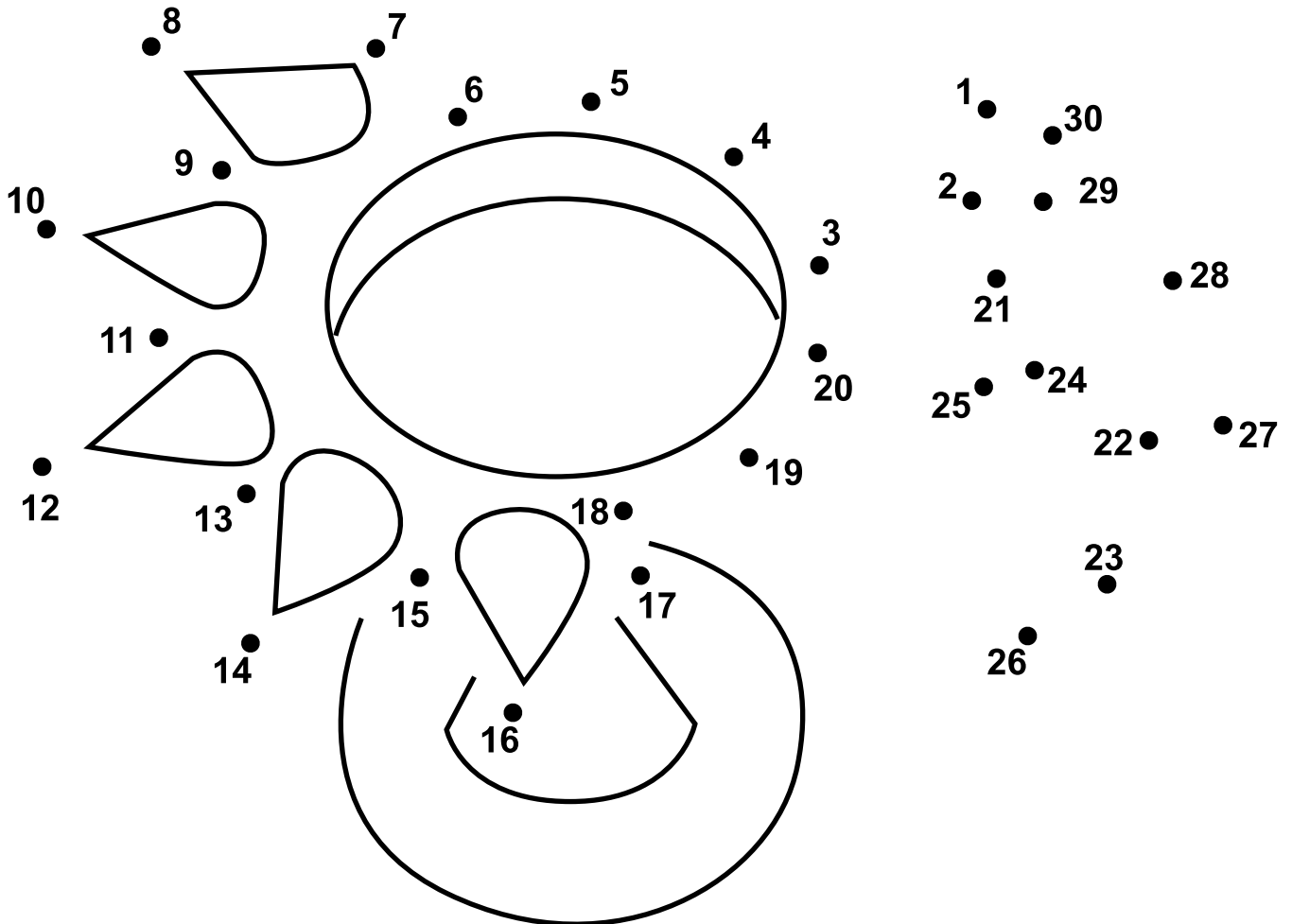

This is used as one of the aarti paraphernalia for the Lord.

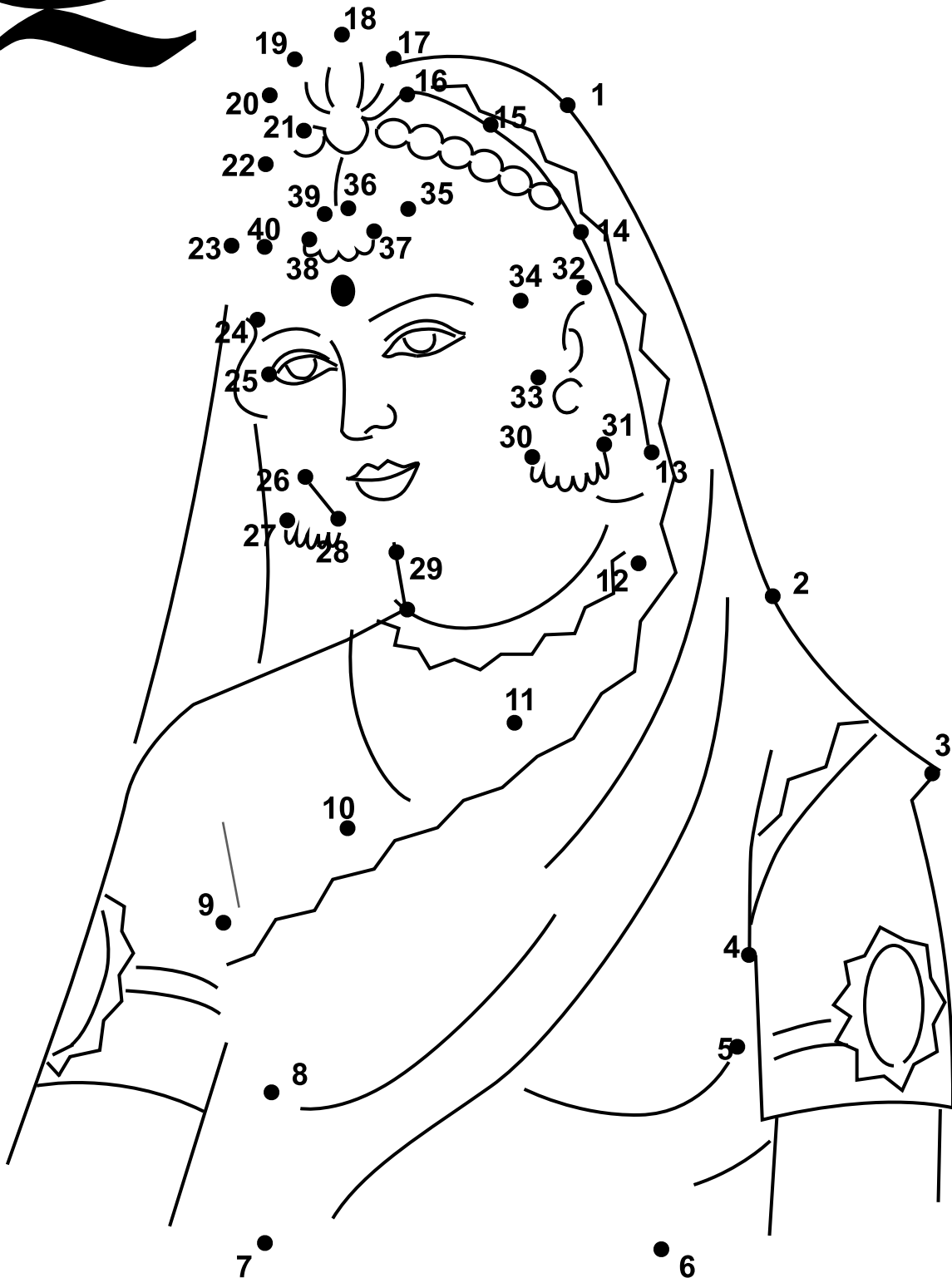

Queen Kunti was the mother of Pandavas & aunt of Lord Krishna. The prayers of queen Kunti are very famous.

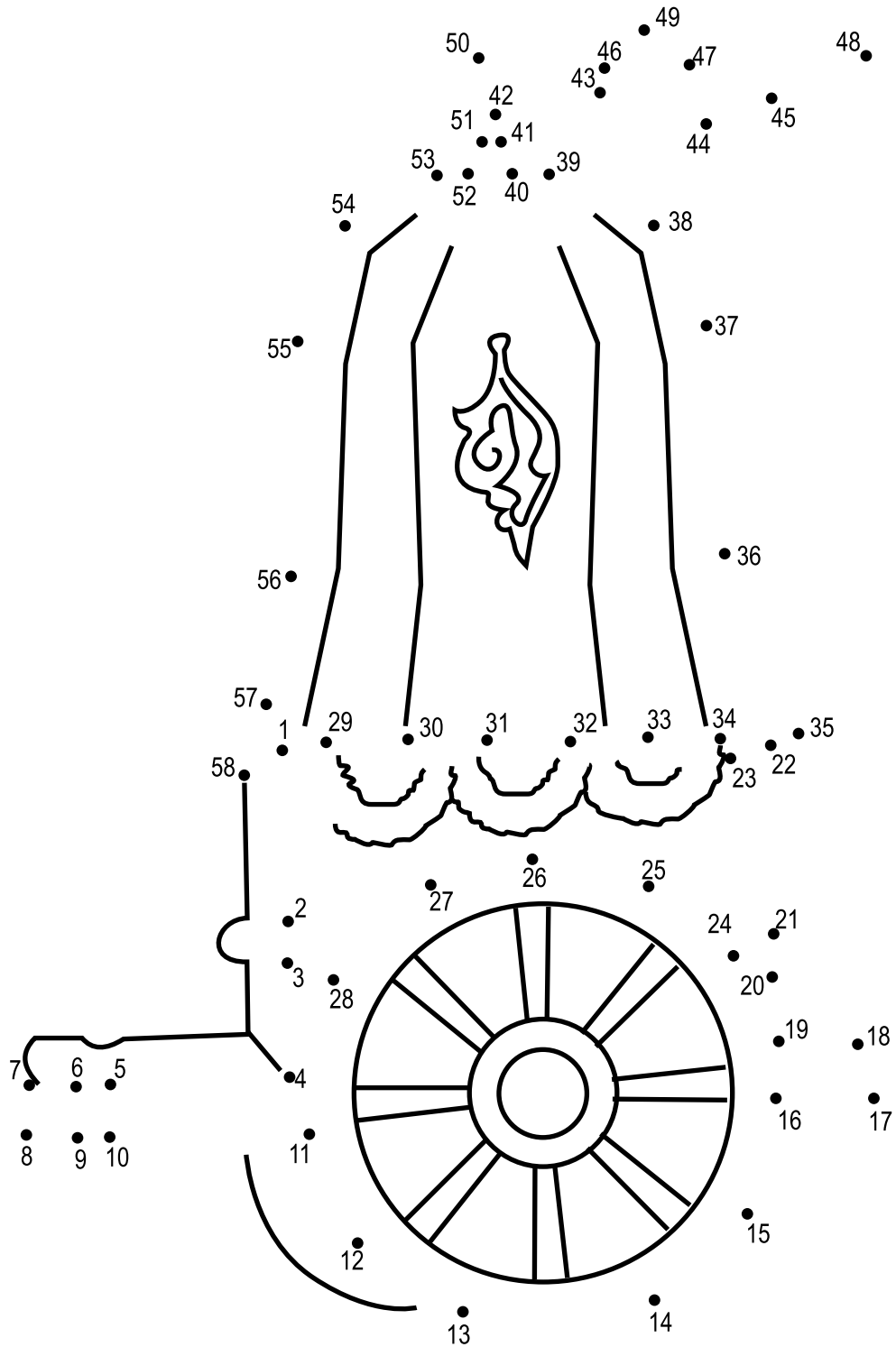

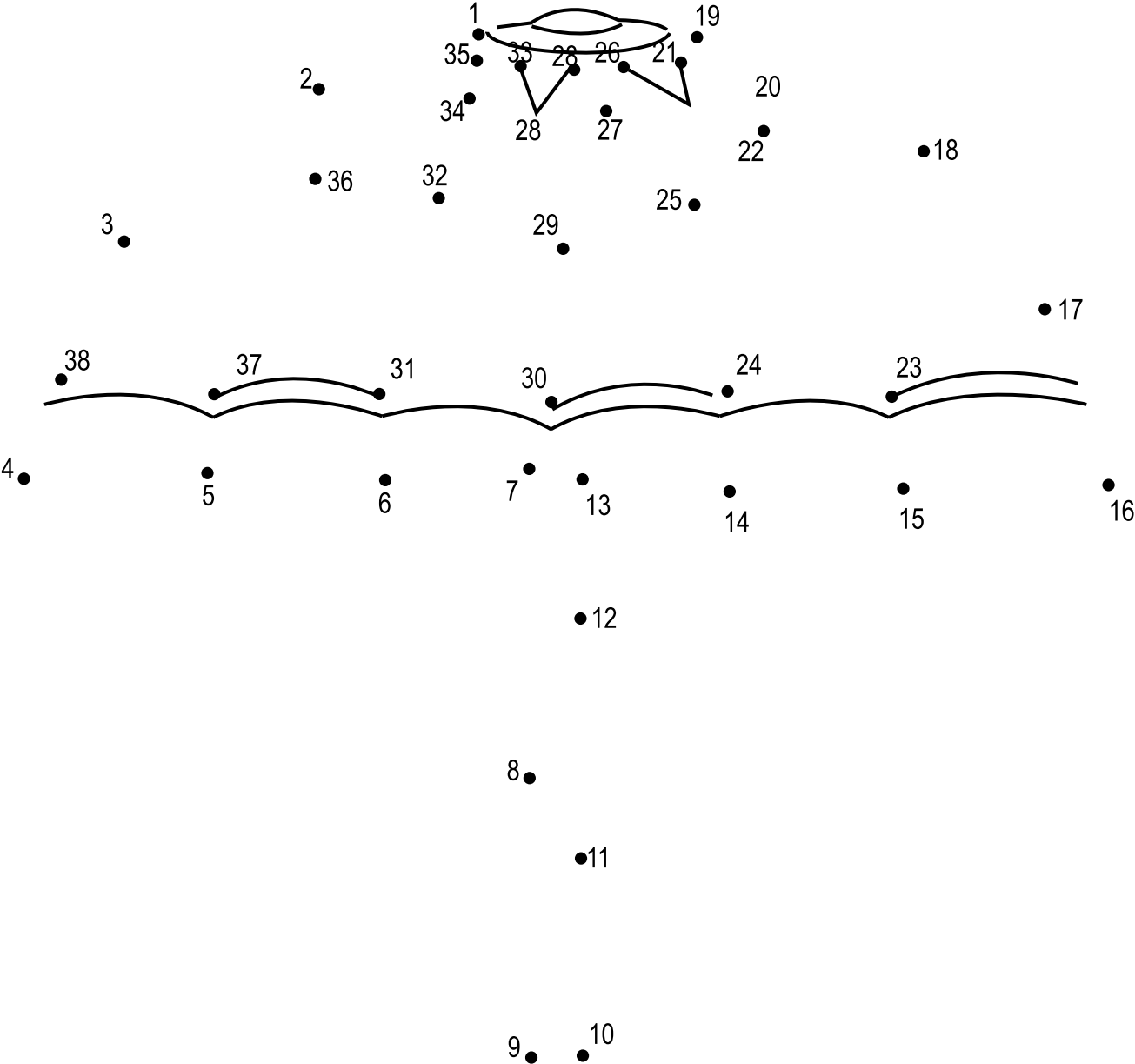

Lord Vamanadeva is always holding in His hands the danda, the umbrella and a waterpot.

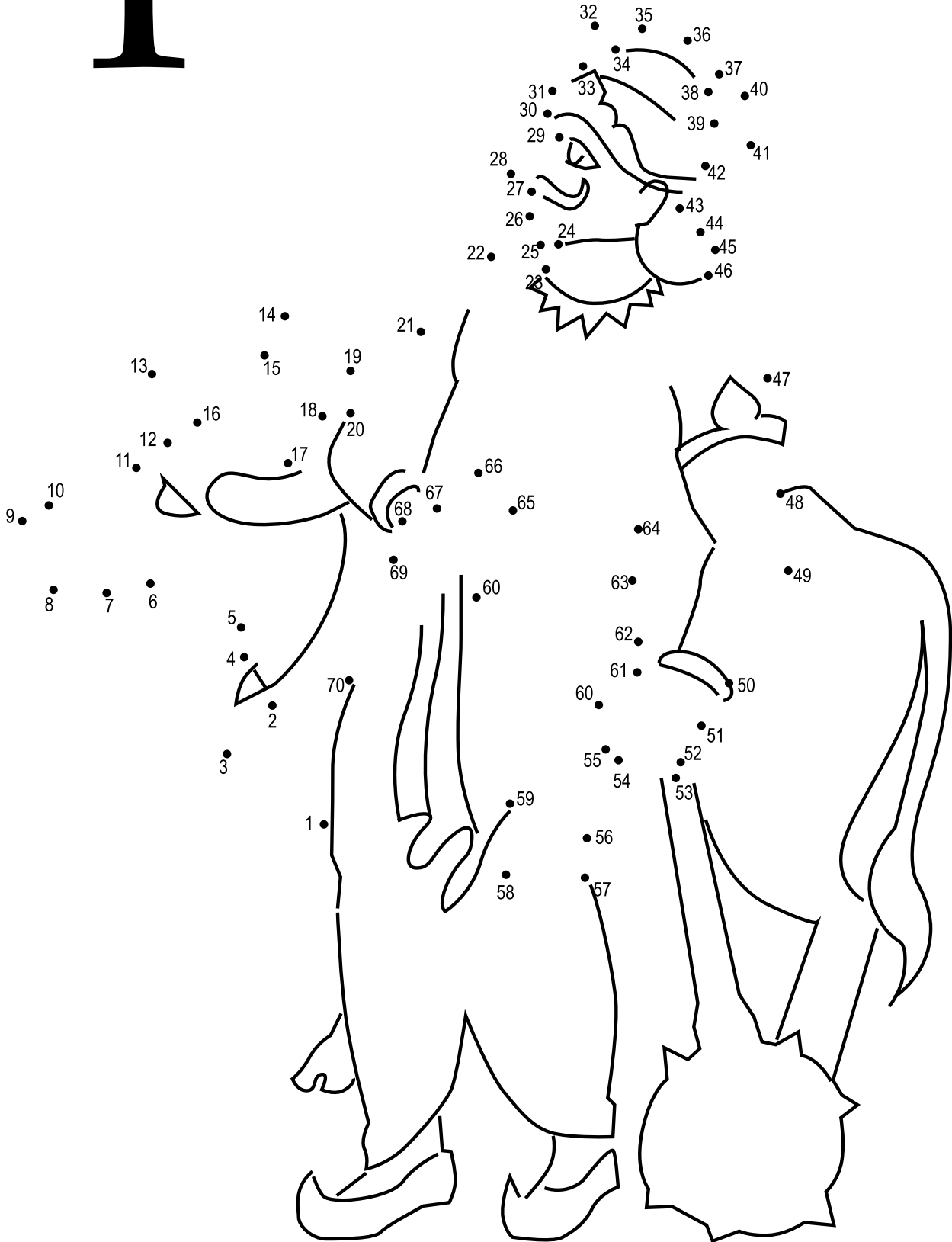
