
RAMA'S VICTORY OVER

ENACTED AND ON THE TENTH
DAY, DUSSEHRA WHICH MARKS
THE DAY OF VICTORY, AN
EFFIGY OF RAVANA IS BURNT.



THE HUGE EFFIGY IS ERECTED ON A MIGHTY FRAMEWORK OF BAMBOOS. IT IS THEN FILLED WITH FIRE-CRACKERS AND COVERED ON THE OUTSIDE WITH COLOURED PAPERS.

ALTHOUGH RAVANA IS DESCRIBED IN THE RAMAYANA AS HAVING TEN HEADS, IN FOLK ART HE IS OFTEN SHOWN WITH ONLY NINE.

ON DUSSEHRA DAY, WHEN THE EFFIGY CATCHES FIRE, IT BLAZES IN FIERY SPLENDOUR TILL THE MIGHTY RAVANA FALLS.














































