



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
Foreword

The things that Lord Krishna can do are so mysterious that sometimes it is difficult to understand them!







PUTANAS DEFEAT


As she was busy working Krishna came up to her. He was really hungry and he wanted to be fed. Mother Yashoda loved Krishna very much and was always happy to take care of him.

KRISHNA CONQUERS THE BAKASURA DEMON



KRISHNA KILLS AGHASURA





Save us from the anger of Indra oh dear Krishna or we will all drown and so will our cows and calves. Help us oh Gopal Hari

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

Help the calf to reach the Govardhan temple


LIFTING OF THE GOVARDHAN HILL

nce Krishna and Balarama saw that the Brahmanas were preparing for the performance of some vedic sacrifices. The cowherd men were also preparing a similar sacrifice in order to satisfy Indra, who was the king of heaven. He was responsible for supplying water in the form of rain to all living entities on earth.

Krishna decided to enquire about all this arrangement. He approached his father. He asked "My dear father what is this arrangement going on for a great sacrifice? What is the result of such a great sacrifice?" Nanda Maharaj explained "This is a sacrifice for King Indra. He is the king of heaven and he sends his clouds to pour down sufficient rain. And due to these rains we have successful agricultural activities. We can then grow crops to feed our families and animals. Therefore this is our traditional ceremonial function to satisfy him."

Lord Krishna then spoke "I don't think you need to worship any demigod for successful agricultural activities. The demigods will anyways be satisfied if we do our duty properly, just as we are satisfied living in this forest of Vrindavan. Our specific relationship is with Govardhan hill. At first Nanda Maharaja and other cowherd men were confused. But later on they realised that Krishna was right. Hence Krishna began advising everyone about the preparation of Govardhan worship. He told the elder Gopis to prepare nice food. He told them to make all kinds of milk preparations such as kheer, sandesh, peda, etc. The cows were decorated beautifully. Brahmanas were given all kinds of grains in charity. They then worshipped Govardhan and circumambulated the hill. All the cooked food items were offered to




Govardhan. Everyone sang and danced joyfully. In this way the worship of Govardhan was completed. King Indra saw all this and was very angry. He thought "How dare this little cowherd boy stop my worship. I shall show him my mighty strength. I will punish all the residents of Vrindavan." He ordered his darkest storm clouds to go and destroy Vrindavan with incessant rain. By King Indra's order, all the dangerous clouds appeared above Vrindavan and began to pour. 







