









Our Message to the Parents.....

His Divine Grace A.C.Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada, the exponent of preaching Krishna consciousness all over the world in the modern times and the founder acharya of ISKCON was very concerned about educating young children in Vedic education. He wrote: "...Child is the father of man, so the basic principle of any type of life is to instruct the children from the very beginning in Krishna consciousness. In the Bhagavatam it is said that the brahmanas are the head of the social body, the ksatriyas are the arms of the social body; the vaisyas are the waist of the social body and the sudras are the legs of the social body. It is not that the legs should not be taken care of and just the head should be cared for. But it is a fact that if there is not a head it is a dead body. The modern civilisation is a sort of social body without a head, or actually it is a dead body. The body is dead since the very beginning of its birth and it is the spirit that keeps it moving. Therefore, spiritual enlightenment is the basic principle of civilisation. The modern civilisation is lacking in that respect and there are so many disadvantages on account of this deficiency. So we have to grow children to become head of the human society and there is great need for this......."





WHO IS BHAGAVAN?


Krishna is the Supreme Personality of Godhead. Krishna has many wonderful qualities. We cannot even count them. We are all part and parcel of Krishna. Therefore we also possess some of the qualities.

Let us take an example to understand this: Have you ever-tasted ocean water? Even the tiniest drop tastes salty. Why? Because it is a part of the big ocean. The drop is of the same quality as the ocean, but it can never be the same in quantity. In the same way we all possess a tiny part of Krishna's vast opulences. Everything we have is meant for His service. We are eternally His servants.

We often see a person who may be rich and famous or intelligent and beautiful. However we can never see a person who possesses all these qualities in full. What to speak of possessing these qualities in full, even the little which we have is temporary.

KRISHNA is called Bhagavan. "Bhaga" means 'opulence' and 'van' means one who possesses'

There are a number of wealthy people in the world who own many houses, factories and cars. People who are very rich are called multi-millionaires. They have beautiful palaces and sometimes own a private island or a beach.

But the wealth of even these multi-millionaires is nothing as compared to the wealth of Krishna. When He came to the earth He displayed His unmatched opulence and wealth. As the king of Dwaraka, He had 16,108 beautiful queens. And He provided each one of them with a magnificent palace. Not only that, every palace was filled with invaluable jewels, diamonds, gold etc. He also had thousands of servants and soldiers. Thus the wealth of Krishna is like the dazzling brightness of the sun, whereas the wealth of even the multi-millionaires is like the brightness of an insignificant firefly.

Now let us hear about the Lord's opulence in the spiritual world, which is far far greater. There are many beautiful prayers, which describe Krishna's abode, Goloka Vrindavana. It is said that He sits on a jeweled throne. His palace is built with spiritual gems and is surrounded by millions of desire fulfilling trees. There are thousands of Goddesses of fortune who are constantly serving the Lord.

Actually we can never understand how rich Krishna is. He is the owner of millions of universes. The sun, moon, stars and planets are all moving under His direction. Everything belongs to Him.

We should know that whatever we have is given to us by Krishna's mercy. We can show our gratefulness to Him by learning how to use everything we have in His service.



2. KRISHNA --- ALL STRONG

Krishna may look like a simple cowherd boy, yet He performs many wonderful pastimes, which show how strong He is. Sometimes He comes to earth to protect His devotees and kill demons.

When Krishna was a small boy, He killed a witch called Putana. On His first birthday, He killed a cart-demon, Shakatasura. He killed many demons like the wind demon, Trinavarta and a huge bird demon named Bakasura. There was a fat serpent demon called Aghasura who tried to swallow the cowherd boys, of course Krishna killed him, too.

Once there was a terrible storm in Vrindavana. It became very dark. Heavy rain was pouring from the sky. It seemed as if the whole of Vrindavana was being drowned. The cowherd men and women all called out to Krishna for protection. Although He was only seven years old, Krishna performed an amazing pastime. He lifted the huge Govardhan Hill on the little finger of His left hand as easily as a child lifts a mushroom.

Krishna said, "My dear devotees, I lifted this hill which will protect you exactly like a huge umbrella. Be happy here along with your animals."

Krishna stood in this way for seven days and seven nights.



Once Krishna's wicked uncle, Kamsa, had arranged a sacrifice called Dhanur Yajna. He had placed a huge bow near the sacrificial arena. Krishna lifted the bow and very easily broke it into two pieces. Later he killed the powerful elephant named Kuvalayapeeda. Kamsa had two powerful wrestlers, Chanura and Mustika. Krishna defeated them too. In the end Krishna dragged Kamsa from his seat and threw him in the wrestling arena. Then Krishna beat Kamsa, repeatedly, on his chest, until he died. In this way Krishna showed His supreme strength even as a small child.

Besides this, Krishna is holding the Sun, Moon, stars and all the planets of the Universe. Indeed we cannot understand how strong Krishna is!

3. KRISHNA --- ALL FAMOUS

Many famous people have come and gone over the ages. Who remembers them now? No one. Some were famous during the brief span of their lifetimes and some may remain famous for a few years after their death. However, most of them remain as neglected statues at parks and crossroads. Their fame is temporary.

Krishna appeared on the earth 5000 years ago. He performed many superhuman pastimes. The great sages have compiled many literatures describing these pastimes. For example, Srimad Bhagvatam, the spotless Purana, has 18,000 verses, which glorify Krishna and His pastimes. His pastimes are so famous that, since time immemorial people, have been relishing these pastimes.

Anant Shesha, the serpent bed of the Lord, has been glorifying Him with His millions of mouths since time immemorial, but still He has not been able to describe even a drop of the glories of Krishna till now.

A famous poet has sung, "Even if all the sky is used as paper, all the trees as pen and all the oceans as ink, still it is insufficient to describe even a drop of Krishna's glories." Such is the unparalleled fame of Krishna!

Bhagavad Gita, the Song of God, contains 700 slokas. Krishna Himself spoke this timeless divine message to His dear friend, Arjuna. It is known as the crest-jewel

of India's spiritual wisdom. Bhagavad Gita is recognized as a masterpiece by all classes of people like scientists, philosophers, thinkers and scholars and even by followers of all religions. Even today it is changing the lives of millions of people around the world.

Devotees of the Lord have constructed grand temples like those in Mayapur, where Krishna is worshipped with great love and reverence. Thousands of people come together there and chant the Holy names of the Lord:

The Vishnu-sahasra-nama-stotra describes thousand names of Lord Krishna. But these are only a few of them; Krishna actually has unlimited number of names according to His unlimited pastimes.






Everyone is attracted by beauty. However every living being is attracted only to others of his own species. For example, human beings are attracted only to other human beings and deer are attracted only to other deer.

But Krishna is all-attractive; when He plays His flute in Vrindavan, all living beings are spontaneously attracted towards Him. The flowing river Yamuna becomes stunned in ecstasy and stops flowing; the hearts of the cows and the deer are charmed as soon as they hear the sweet sound; they spread their long ears and listen intently with tears of joy gliding down their eyes. When the calves, who are drinking milk, hear His flute, their mouths stop moving and they just drink the nectar of the sweet sound of His flute. The birds stop flying and sit frozen on the branches and twigs of the nearby trees; non-moving beings like the stones melt in ecstasy. The clouds stop moving and serve as a soothing umbrella for Krishna.

In Vrindavan, the gopis are engaged in various activities. But as soon as they hear Krishna playing on His flute, some gopis, who are drawing water from the well, let go of the rope; some gopis, who are churning the butter, just stop churning; those who are engaged in house-hold duties, leave everything and rush to meet Krishna with great haste. Whatever they are doing, they just drop it and run swiftly to the forest to meet Krishna. Such is the all-attractiveness of Krishna.

Nothing in the three worlds can match the beauty of Krishna. Krishna has a beautiful threefold-bending form and a charming bluish-black complexion. He wears a peacock



feather on His head. His eyes are like blooming lotus petals. His nose is like a sesame flower. His lips are like a bimba fruit. There is always a captivating smile on His moonlike face. He holds an enchanting flute in His hands and attracts all His devotees with its sweet sound. He wears a beautiful Vaijayanti garland and a moon locket around His neck. He is dressed in beautiful yellow dhoti. His unique loveliness attracts everyone in the universe. Thus His beauty surpasses all concepts of beauty in the material world.

In the Bhagavad Gita Chapter 10, sloka 41, Krishna says "All opulent, beautiful and glorious creations spring from but a spark of My splendour." Hence the beauty of everything in this world is actually due to the beauty of Krishna manifesting through these things. Therefore we should be attracted not to the beauty of this world but to the eternal beauty of Krishna.

Krishna is the Supreme Personality of Godhead. Krishna knows everything. All knowledge comes from Krishna. He knows the past, the present and the future. He is the source of all the Vedas and the ultimate goal of studying all the Vedas is to know Krishna.

Krishna is present as Paramatma in the hearts of all living beings - humans, animals and even plants. Thus, Krishna witnesses our every thought, word and deed.

While speaking Bhagavad gita Krishna told Arjuna that He instructed the same Bhagavad gita to the sun-god, Vivasvan, millions of years ago. Arjuna asked Krishna, "Vivasvan is senior by birth to You. How can I understand that you instructed this science to him?" Krishna replied, "Many many births both you and I have passed. I can remember all of them, but you cannot". Thus Krishna and Arjuna both have come to this world many times. Krishna can remember all those births and Arjuna cannot because Krishna is the Supreme Personality of Godhead who is all knowing and Arjuna is a living entity.





There are millions of universes. And there are immeasurable atoms in each universe. Krishna is present in every atom of each universe and so He knows everything that is happening in every part of every universe.

Even when Krishna and Balarama came to the earth, They were still all knowing. They did not need to go to any school to get knowledge. They accepted Sandipani Muni as their guru only to teach us, by Their own example, how important it is for us to accept a spiritual master. And even while studying, They displayed Their extraordinary intelligence by mastering all the sixty-four subjects in just sixty-four days.




6. KRISHNA --- ALL RENOUNCED

When we have something we like and we lose it, we feel very sad. It is because we are very attached to it. We have seen in the last few lessons how Krishna has so many opulences. But His real opulence is: He is not at all attached to any of them.

How is this? Krishna's renunciation is illustrated through His loving pastimes with the devotees. Let us now look at a few of them. As a little child He used to carry Nanda Baba's sandals on His own head. He allowed Yashoda Maiya to bind Him with ropes. This is the same All strong Personality of Godhead who kills wicked demons and lifted the great Govardhan hill to protect His devotees. Krishna is defeated only by the love of His devotees.

Krishna left behind His comforts and opulences and went to the forest to study in the gurukula. Krishna-The All Knowledgeable, took guidance from a spiritual master. Why? To set an example for us. He is neither attached to wealth or knowledge.



While He was at the gurukula, He performed menial service for His guru and gurumata. She often sent Him to fetch firewood and do other small chores at school.

The seven young men each tried in turn, but even the strongest failed. "It's not possible," they exclaimed, "Watch," their Guru said, cutting the rope with a knife. Taking each stick on its own, he very easily snapped it into two; " I am getting very old. Soon I will die. You are like a bundle of sticks. If you try to help each other, cooperate and work together, you will be strong and serve me well. But if you become divided and fight, you will become weak like these separate sticks. And then, who will care for our Radha and Krishna Deities? Remember united we stand, divided we fall."

Realizing their folly, the seven disciples agreed to set the ruby in a gold ring. That ring, they decided, was to decorate one of Krishna's fingers. Their Guru, pleased at this decision, finally felt ready to leave them. Soon after, he peacefully gave up his body and returned to the spiritual world.

Later, when the people came to see the old brahmana's famous Deities they often asked, "How did Krishna get such a beautiful ring?"
The disciples would always answer, "By the strength of a bundle of sticks."


Thus, we see that the Lord helps those who help themselves.




Seeing the difference between the proud brahmana and the faith of the humble cobbler. Narada easily understood why they were to be rewarded in different ways.


- To educate children in Krishna Consciousness as taught in Bhagavad Gita and Srimad Bhagavatam.

- To train children to have a strong and ideal character by teaching them values and their practical application in everyday life.
- To give training so that they can take up proper leadership positions in the future and guide the whole human society.

His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada said, "Let the small children from all good families come and take education from us. They can be certain their children will get the real knowledge which will create the best citizens of brahminical type, clean, honest, law abiding, industrious, they will have all good qualities. In the future we expect to change the face of the world. And the child is the father of the man. So the basic principle of any type of life is to instruct the children from the very beginning in Krishna Consciousness. Such children grow to be the topmost leaders of the society."

Activities at BPS, Pune

The children are divided into two groups: Krishna / Junior (Age 5 to 10 yrs.) and Balaram / Senior (Age 11 to 15 yrs.) There are 6 levels of Junior courses and 6 levels of Senior courses. Each course lasts approximately for a semester (6 months). There are prescribed text books for each course and children learn a variety of topics — Etiquette and behavior, Japa meditation, Music and Kirtans, Character build-up, Story telling, Personality development, etc.

These are achieved through an entertaining and absorbing blend of Drama, Puppet shows, slide & video shows, spiritual quiz, etc.



His Divine Grace A.C.Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada, <u>Founder Acarva:</u> International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON)

Srila Prabhupada appeared in this world in 1896 in Calcutta, India. He first met his spiritual master, Srila Bhaktisiddhanta Sarasvati Goswami, in Calcutta in 1922. Bhaktisiddhanta Sarasvati, a prominent religious scholar and the founder of sixty-four Gaudiya Mathas (Vedic Institutes), liked this educated young man and convinced him to dedicate his life to teaching Vedic knowledge. Srila Prabhupada became his student and eleven years later, his formally initiated disciple.

At their first meeting, Srila Bhaktisiddhanta Sarasvati Thakura requested Srila Prabhupada to broadcast Vedic knowledge through the English language. In the years that followed, Srila Prabhupada wrote a commentary on Bhagavad-gita. He conceived, wrote and edited "Back to Godhead", an English magazine dedicated to his spiritual master, to spread the names of Lord Krishna in the west. The magazine continues to be published bimonthly by his present day followers.

In 1965 when he first arrived by freighter in New York City, Srila Prabhupada was practically penniless. It was after almost a year of great difficulty that he established the International Society for Krishna Consciousness in July of 1966. Before passing away on 14th November, 1977, he guided the society and saw it grow to a worldwide confederation of more than one hundred asramas, schools, temples, institutes and farm communities.

Srila Prabhupada's most significant contribution, however, is his books. Highly respected by the academic community for their authority, depth and clarity, they serve as standard textbooks in numerous college courses. His writings have been translated into over thirty languages. The Bhaktivedanta Book Trust, established in 1972 to publish his works, has thus become the world's largest publisher in the field of Indian religion and philosophy.

Srila Prabhupada had a great desire to preach the message of Bhagavad gita to the Children and Youth, as they are the foundation of any country. At ISKCON Pune, we have Bhakta Prahlad School for children between age groups: Junior (5 to 9), Senior (10 to 15) and ISKCON Youth Forum (IYF) for students above 15 years of age. We are bringing out these books with the view to educate children and youth in the principles of Vedic knowledge.
